2) Instead of answering the lawyer's question directly, Jesus told the Parable of the Good Samaritan. How did the poor Jewish man in the parable get injured?


- He fell off his donkey.

BIBLE QUIZ ANSWERS

1) Jesus had been preaching, "Love your neighbor," which was a part of the Old Testament Law (Leviticus 19:18). One day a lawyer asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" What was the lawyer's purpose for asking the question?

The answer is: He wanted to test Jesus' interpretation of the Law.

Luke 10:25-37. The English word "love" can mean many different things. The original Bible word used here, agape, is known as "Christian love." It means having high regard for other people, sincerely wishing them well and extending caring concern.

At the time of Jesus, the religious elite of the Jews had interpreted Leviticus 19:18 to apply only among the Jews. They denied any obligation to extend their love to persons outside their own religion and nationality. Thus, the lawyer was trying to test Jesus' "orthodoxy."

4) What is the main lesson of Jesus' Parable of the Good Samaritan?

The answer is: Extend your love to everyone in the world.

The Samaritan took pity on the poor man who had been robbed and beaten. He gave freely of both his time and his money to help this Jewish man who was not only a stranger of a different religion, but also an enemy from a foreign land. In His parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus challenges us (Luke 10:37) to "Go and do likewise."

2) Instead of answering the lawyer's question directly, Jesus told the Parable of the Good Samaritan. How did the poor Jewish man in the parable get injured?

The answer is: He was robbed and beaten.

Luke 10:30 In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead.

3) Two Jewish religious leaders passed by the injured man without stopping to help. Finally, a Samaritan man came by, stopped and did everything possible to assist. Why did it take an extra measure of compassion for the Samaritan man to come to the assistance of the injured man beside the road?

The answer is: The Jews and Samaritans despised each other.

The Jews and Samaritans had been enemies for hundreds of years. The Jews of Jesus' society were contemptuous of the Samaritans, considering them to be ceremonially unclean, socially outcast, religious heretics.
