Answers to the Bible Quiz

1) When Jesus was born in Bethlehem, first one angel then a great company of angels appeared to shepherds in the fields near Bethlehem to tell them the good news of the birth of Jesus. What did the angels say to the Shepherds?

The correct answer is: All of the above

[Luke 2:8-14](#). Instead of "peace, goodwill toward men!" modern Bible translations say something like, "peace among men with whom He is pleased." The difference is due to a single letter in different versions of ancient Greek manuscripts.

2) What were the shepherds doing when they heard the good news?

The correct answer is: Keeping watch over their flocks at night

[Luke 2:8](#). The angels announced Jesus' birth not to kings, princes and chief priests, but to the poor and lowly shepherds. This event foreshadowed Jesus' ministry; Jesus' message was accepted by the common people but rejected by the wealthy and powerful.

3) When the shepherds heard the good news of Jesus' birth, they decided to go see the wondrous event for themselves. How did they find Jesus?

The correct answer is: They were told to look for a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.

[Luke 2:12-13](#). The angels announced that Jesus is the long awaited Christ, Savior and Messiah. However, many people had expected a Messiah who would restore the political and military glory of Israel rather than a spiritual leader. They didn't understand the extraordinary gift of the Kingdom of God that Jesus brought to earth.

Swaddling clothes were bands of cloth wrapped around an infant to restrict movement. It was believed at the time that swaddling helped the arms and legs develop correctly, and it was a sign of parental love and care.

4) The shepherds went in haste to Bethlehem to see the child the angels had told them about. What else did they do?

The correct answer is: They told many people what the angels had said.

[Luke 2:15-20](#). The shepherds did not hesitate to share the joyous news of the Savior's birth. They became the first preachers of the gospel.
